Checklist for Parents:

Choosing a childcare service for your child

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Use this checklist as a guideline when you are choosing an early childhood service for your child. Always book to visit and look at a few different options before choosing a place. Remember to trust your instinct and choose the service that feels the best for your child and your family.

Before you visit research your options online and find out:

Location: proximity to your home or work place
Size of the service and facilities offered (look through the photo gallery)
Opening hours and options for attendance (sessions, all day, dome may have minimum requirements to attend)
Ownership: is this a community based, association operated, home based or privately owned service?

What are the important non-negotiables in childcare for your family? Make your own notes here

When you visit the service: LOOK and LISTEN FOR

How are the staff interacting with each other?
How well do the children seem to be engaged in play?
Are staff attending to any crying children kindly and reasonably quickly?
How are the staff interacting with children?
Does there seem to be enough equipment and resources for the number of children here without having to wait for long periods? What is the quality or condition of the resources and equipment like?
How does it feel here? • Welcoming? • Loving? • Attentive? • Clear limits and boundaries for children's behaviour?
 Does the environment look clean and hygienic but not overly sterile? Some mess from children playing is a good sign. If things are too tidy or the environment does not look payed in, chances are children are not being given the opportunity to play and explore as much as they should be.
Look to see the service's license (this should be displayed and include the license conditions)



When you visit the service: Ask the following questions;

How many children are you licensed to care for here?	What are the age groups you cater for? Are these age groups separated or cared for together?
What is your philosophy on play and	What are the fees and terms of payment?
learning? Do you have any particular curriculum here?	How long have your staff been here for?
What is the settling process? How many visits will my child be able to have here?	What are the staff ratios? (how many children per staff member?)
Is there a key teacher or primary care system here?	How many of the staff are qualified and to what level?
How many staff have a first aid certificate?	What are the rules about choosing to play inside or ourside?
What opportunities will my child have to explore all areas of the curriculum?	Are the staff required to clean the centre more than cleaning up after meals, play and bathroom incidents?
What food is provided if any?How do meal times operate?What can my child to if they are hungry outside of meal times?	Will I be required to pay for any absences for illness and family holidays?
 How do children access drinking water? 	How is children's behaviour managed here?



Check what is provided by the ECE service and what you will need to provide for your child:
